



## 2016 GENERAL GRANTEES

**\$20,900** was distributed to **10** organizations in the form of General Grants in 2016 through the Community Impact grantmaking program.

**Barnstable Senior Center, \$900** to support the "Voice Within" Artistic Expression Program for clients in the Adult Supportive Day Program. Through the use of a variety of art media, those dealing with dementia can tell their stories, express their emotions and connect with the world.

**Cape Cod Commercial Fishermen's Alliance, \$2,500** to support a pilot shellfish-based education program for 3rd grade students on Cape Cod, instilling in them the importance and fragility of the Cape's blue water economy, and the role of aquaculture in cleaning our waters and feeding our community.

**Cape Rep Theater, \$3,000** to support the creation of an interview-based theater piece exploring the relationship between today's fishermen and the challenges of climate and social change.

**Cotuit Center for the Arts, \$1,000** to support the Second Annual Brazilian Music and Cultural Festival which celebrates Brazil's rich cultural heritage and fosters an inter-cultural exchange between Brazilians and non-Brazilians on Cape Cod.

**Cultural Center of Cape Cod, \$5,000** to support *Mocktail Mixer Series: the Art of Abstinence*. The program will involve monthly free and substance-free events based on various themes (offering music, dance, arts workshops, paint nights, poetry and music open mics, etc.) with an emphasis on artistic engagement, socializing, and celebration for those in recovery from addiction.

**Falmouth Volunteers In Public Schools, \$2,500** to support strategic planning and to gather focused input from key constituent groups: staff, volunteers, students, and community partners.

**Glenna Kohl Fund for Hope, \$1,000** to support the purchase of a 20x20 foot community shade structure to be permanently installed on a public beach or other exposed recreational facility in the Town of Barnstable. A sunscreen dispenser will also be included in the project.

**Shea's Youth Basketball, \$1,000** to support Shea's Youth Basketball Association (SYBA) Winter Basketball League. SYBA is a nonprofit focused on providing Cape Cod youth, between the ages of 12 and 16, with opportunities to build their character and improve their life skills through basketball.

**Suffolk University Moakley Center, \$2,000** to support scholarships for Cape Cod nonprofits to participate in the course "Strategically Embracing Change", held on Cape Cod. The program is a 36 hour, 3 credit, graduate-level course: a 30 hour classroom module and a 6 hour on-location consulting Practicum.

**Sustainable CAPE, \$2,000** to support FLAVORx, a pilot project to improve health and wellness of food insecure populations with chronic diseases.
