# How to Apply

## 1. REVIEW THIS REFERENCE BOOKLET

This booklet contains eligibility requirements for the more than 75 scholarship funds administered by The Cape Cod Foundation. We strongly encourage you to go through this booklet prior to beginning an application to gauge your eligibility.

## 2. GO ONLINE TO APPLY: CAPECODFOUNDATION.ORG

Scholarship applications are online! Visit our website to download a copy of this booklet and for links to all online applications.

## 3. REVIEW THE APPLICATION DEADLINES

While the deadline for most scholarships is April 1, some vary. Incomplete applications and/or late applications, including late attachments, WILL NOT be accepted.

## 4. REVIEW THE APPLICATION MATERIALS

The specific materials needed for each scholarship are detailed in the online application.

IN GENERAL, you should be prepared to submit:

- At least TWO CURRENT letters of recommendation from teachers, professors, guidance counselors, coaches, employers, etc. A High School student must submit a recommendation from his/her guidance counselor. Your counselor will also be asked to provide your transcript and other academic information.
- The Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from your FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR).
- A personal essay and any additional material required for specific scholarships.
- College Students must submit the most recent academic transcript listing all coursework to date. (Transcripts can be unofficial). Transcripts must clearly indicate GPA.

# General Information

- Scholarships are paid directly to the college and are made to US-based educational institutions ONLY.
- The award amounts and the number of awards listed in this booklet are approximate and may vary.
- Please pay close attention to special requirements and deadlines for each scholarship for which you are applying.
- The Foundation reserves the right not to issue awards for certain scholarships as may be determined necessary from time to time due to extenuating circumstances.
- Each scholarship has its own evaluation criteria, but the majority are based on financial need, academic merit and non-academic activities.
- The selection process is competitive. Students who receive an award for one academic year may/may not receive it in subsequent years. Students may reapply even if they did not receive an award the previous year.
- Most 4-year awards require the student to maintain a certain GPA to continue receiving benefits. Students who receive a scholarship will receive an award letter which may outline other criteria for maintaining the award.
- Unless otherwise noted, students must reapply every year to be considered for awards.

We try to ensure that the scholarship dollars students receive from the Foundation will be used to directly offset their self-help need, instead of reducing institutional grants. However, institutions/colleges/universities may adjust financial aid packages based on the scholarships you receive from outside sources. Usually, they will use an outside scholarship to replace unmet need, or reduce the amount of loans or work study before adjusting grants or scholarships. However, policies vary and students should check with their institutions' financial aid office.
