



## 2018 MCV-BCEHO EMS Fund Grantees

**\$5,029 was distributed in 2018 through the MCV-BCEHO EMS grantmaking program**

**Eastham Fire Department, \$3,015 to purchase bleeding control equipment**

The bleeding control equipment can be used for large scale events such as shark attacks or an active shooter incident. The department will put these supplies in a "go pack" so that all the equipment can be brought quickly to the scene.

**Orleans Fire Department, \$2,014 to purchase "Stop the Bleed" kits**

These funds will support the purchase of one "Stop the Bleed" training kit and with six public access "Stop the Bleed" kits. The training kit will be utilized to teach Stop the Bleed training classes throughout the community. The public access kits will provide bystanders and initial first responders with quick and easy access to essential medical equipment to stop life-threatening bleeding in public buildings and populated public areas.
