



## 2018 GENERAL GRANTEES

**\$33,000 was distributed to 10 organizations in the form of General Grants in 2018 through the Community Impact grantmaking program.**

**Behavioral Health Innovators, \$5,000** to support RecoveryBUILD School-Based Alternative Peer Group (APG) at Cape Cod high schools. APGs are a comprehensive adolescent recovery support model that integrates recovering peers and prosocial activities into an evidence-based clinical practice.

**Boch Center, \$2,000** to support ArtWeek Cape Cod, an award-winning, ten-day spring arts festival featuring unique, affordable and creative experiences that are participatory, interactive, or offer behind-the-scenes access to artists or the creative process.

**Cape Arts & Entertainment for the Cape Conservatory, \$5,000** to pilot Carnegie Hall's Link Up program. Link Up is a unique, interactive, and engaging year-long program in which students in grades 3-5 learn and perform orchestral repertoire on the recorder, violin, voice or body percussion and take part in creative work such as composing their own pieces inspired by the orchestral music they have studied.

**Cape Cod Challenger Club, \$2,500** to support the Winter Program which provides social, educational, and athletic activities to 50-60 children and young adults with developmental and/or intellectual disabilities.

**Cape Cod Commercial Fishermen's Alliance, \$3,000** to support the Pier to Plate 2.0 program. During Pier to Plate 2.0, the Fishermen's Alliance runs community outreach and public education programs from June through October, with the goal of increasing the public's knowledge of local seafood and where they can source it.

**Cape Cod Museum of Art, \$1,500** to support Creative Outlets: Finding Your Voice Through Arts. Creative Outlets is a series of free, therapeutic art-based workshops for at-risk youth age 12-16. Through the arts and mentorship, participants will not only have fun and engage their imaginations in a group where they feel they fit in, but they also learn the life and coping skills, and the resilience, to meet challenges.

**Family Pantry of Cape Cod \$4,500** to support food for local families. The Family Pantry of Cape Cod provides food to over 9,300 people annually (4% of Barnstable County's year-round population).

**Harwich Ecumenical Council, The Children's Center \$2,500** to support the Tuition Assistance Program. The Children's Center provides early childhood education and nurturing care for 30 children who are 2.9 years – 5 years old in a full day, year-round program.

**Helping Our Women, \$4,500** to support the COMPASS Program: Coaching, One-on-One Mentoring, Partnering, Assisting, Supporting and Socializing. The goal of the program is to enhance the health and well-being of women on the Outer Cape by providing new opportunities for one-on-one support from a volunteer.

**HopeHealth, \$2,500** to support the launch of Camp BraveHeart, a children's bereavement program. Camp BraveHeart will offer a free full-day camp experience designed for children between 5 and 17 years old. At Camp BraveHeart, children will experience a safe and loving environment created by specially trained volunteers and grief counselors who will help them cope with the loss of their loved one.
